Protecting Randolph: Thanks and Recognition for Our First Responders

As fall arrives and our routines shift back to school, work, and seasonal activities, it's the perfect time to pause and recognize the dedicated individuals who keep our community safe and strong. Whether behind the scenes or on the front lines, our police officers, firefighters, and rescue squad volunteers work tirelessly every day to serve and protect the people of Randolph.

Public safety has always been a top priority for the Randolph Township Council, and we're proud to support our outstanding first responders. Whether it's patrolling our roads, responding to emergencies, or stepping up during community events, these individuals go above and beyond to serve our town with professionalism and empathy.

Our Randolph Police Department, led by Chief Will Harzula, is made up of 31 highly trained officers who are committed to protecting and serving our community. From traffic safety to community outreach to emergency response, their work is wide-ranging and always essential. The Police Department recently achieved Agency Re-Accreditation through the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police Law Enforcement Accreditation Program. This prestigious recognition underscores the department's unwavering commitment to professionalism, excellence, and the highest standards of law enforcement.

Our Randolph Township Fire Department continues to serve with unwavering commitment, all on a 100% volunteer basis. With 88 active firefighters serving out of four stations across town, these men and women are ready to respond at any hour to fires, rescues, and emergency calls. In 2024 alone, they responded to 629 calls for service. These volunteers train regularly, stay up to date on best practices, and work closely with township officials to ensure they have the tools and equipment needed to serve our residents safely and effectively.

Equally vital is our Randolph Rescue Squad, which provides basic life support and emergency medical services to our community. With 69 active members, the squad responded to a record 900 calls in 2024. These volunteers also provide standby services at township events, making them a visible and reassuring presence throughout the year. Like the fire department, the Rescue Squad is a 100% volunteer organization that has been serving Randolph since 1967.

We are fortunate to have such capable and committed first responders here in Randolph. Whether paid or volunteer, they give their time, talents, and energy in service to others, and for that, they deserve our deepest thanks. As mayor, and on behalf of the entire Township Council, I want to express our appreciation to every individual serving in uniform. Your dedication keeps Randolph strong, and we are truly thankful.

SENIOR AND SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY RECIPIENTS

NEW FOR 2025

New Jersey Combined Property Tax Relief Applications: (Form PAS-1) P.L. 2023, c.75 and P.L. 2024, c.88 establishes the new Stay NJ Program and requires a combined application to apply for: Property Tax Reimbursement (PTR/Senior Freeze), ANCHOR, and Stay NJ Program.

You have until October 31, 2025 to file your 2024 application. PTR/Senior Freeze: 65 or older or disabled as of 12/31/23 will still offer the reimbursement of property tax increase.

ANCHOR
Open to all ages based on NJ-1040 Gross Income. Benefits are subject to income/ownership.

Stay NJ: must be 65 by 12/31/24 and may offer 50% reimbursement of property taxes with a \$6,500 max. All benefits are subject to State budget appropriations. The filing deadline is October 31, 2025. For more information, please call 1-888-238-1233 or log onto the State's webpage:

Clean Communities

Paper Shredding

The Randolph Township Health Department will once again offer confidential paper shredding services to residents, free of charge, from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM on Saturday, September 27 in the Municipal Building parking lot. Residents must have their NJ driver’s license available as proof of residency. Residents will be required to follow the traffic pattern, park where directed, and remain in their vehicles. A DPW employee will assist residents with their items.

This shredding service is:

- Randolph residents only
- Personal, confidential documents generated in the home only (not commercial or home-business generated).
- A maximum of three file boxes per household (file box = 1.5 cubic feet).
- Confidential documents. This does not include junk mail and store flyers or solicitations.
- Documents that are free of any metal clips, rings or binders (plastic file folders, x-rays, CDs, etc. are prohibited).

Bulk Collection Week

Fall Bulk Collection week is Monday, October 6 through Friday, October 10.

Items must be placed curbside by 6:00 AM Monday, October 6. For this collection, Blue Diamond will be through each street only one time. No return trips will be made.

Items accepted include non-metal furniture, couches, mattresses, box springs, rugs/ carpeting (rolled and tied in four-foot lengths). Household trash must be clearly separated from your bulk items. Cardboard boxes cannot be used as receptacles for bulk items. Loose items must be placed in trash cans or disposable bags. Latex paint MUST be dried out. Paint cans can be filled with kitty litter & placed into a trash can; mixture must be solid.

ITEMS NEVER COLLECTED during the bi-annual bulk collection and/or weekly curbside trash collection include all recyclable items (metal, paper, e-waste), appliances/white goods, prohibited items (hazardous waste, building materials, scrap metal, tires, and items weighing more than 200 lbs.), used motor oil, vegetative waste (including grass clippings, leaves & branches). A Letter from the Superintendent

As we welcome the fall season, I am pleased to share an update on the progress and achievements within our school district. Since the community passed the referendum last year, we have made significant strides in enhancing school facilities to provide a better learning environment for our students.

Over the summer, we completed several key projects, including partial roof replacements at our high school, middle school and Center Grove Elementary; the renovation of the high school Commons entrance; new bleachers in the RHS main gymnasium; replacement of the two turf fields and the track at Bauer Field; and a renovation of Shongum’s main office. Specific to the referendum, we completed a full roof replacement at Shongum and Ironia Elementary, HVAC work, and security projects across the district. These improvements reflect our commitment to maintaining and upgrading our facilities to ensure a safe and effective learning environment for all.

Our students continue to embrace athletics, visual and performing arts, and clubs, while achieving strong academic success. They consistently perform above state averages on English Language Arts and math assessments. Additionally, last year at our high school, we increased access to Advanced Placement (AP) courses and saw an increase in the district passing rate. We had 203 AP scholars, the most in the district's history, and students took 1,013 AP exams, the highest number ever.

I extend heartfelt appreciation to our teachers who tirelessly educate and inspire our students every day. Their commitment to fostering a love for learning and helping each student reach their full potential is truly commendable for inspiring students each day, to our custodial, grounds, and maintenance staff for keeping our schools safe and welcoming, to our support staff for ensuring smooth operations, and lastly, I want to express my appreciation for the leaders throughout our school community for their continuous advocacy for improvement and innovation in our schools. Their vision and commitment to always seeking opportunities for growth play a crucial role in shaping the future of our district to leaders across our school community for their advocacy and commitment to improvement and innovation.

Together, we are shaping a brighter future for Randolph, adaptable to the needs of an ever-changing world. Thank you for your continued support and dedication to our community

Keep our Roads Safe

The Randolph Police Department is asking for your help in keeping our roads safe during leaf collection season. Leaf piles in the roadway can be dangerous—they're difficult to see at night, become slippery when wet, and can narrow the roadway, making it unsafe for vehicles to pass. To keep our streets safe and clear, please place your leaves curbside no sooner than seven days prior to your scheduled pickup. Leaves must be in sealed biodegradable bags and placed at least 10 feet from any storm drain inlet.

Property owners, tenants, contractors, and landscapers may also sweep, blow, or rake leaves to the curb within the seven-day period before collection. However, leaves should never block storm drains or create hazards for vehicles. Thank you for helping us keep Randolph safe and for doing your part this fall season

Slow Down, School is Back

The Randolph Township Police Department would like to remind motorists to slow down when school is in session. The Randolph Schools have flashing speed limit signs on surrounding roadways to remind motorists that the speed limit is 25 MPH when the lights are flashing or when students are present. The flashing signs are programmed to activate at arrival and dismissal times for the schools.

Crossing Guards are posted at several busy crosswalks in school zones to help students safely get to and from school. Crossing Guards have a “stop” paddle that motorists must obey and wait for everyone to exit the crosswalk before continuing to drive. The Crossing Guards receive yearly training and work at their posts in all different kinds of weather conditions and have an important role in ensuring students and parents walk to and from the school safely.

Please obey school speed limit signs and crossing guards at their school posts, and let's work together to make this another safe school year.

Fire Department News

Key Fall Fire Prevention Tips

As the leaves begin to change, our homes become cozy havens from the cooler temperatures. However, this season also brings an increased risk of fires due to heating equipment, cooking, and seasonal decorations. The Randolph Township Fire Department is committed to ensuring the safety of our community. Below are essential tips and reminders to help keep your family and property safe during the autumn months. Your vigilance and preparedness are our strongest allies in fire prevention.

- **Heating Safety** – Have furnaces, fireplaces, and chimneys inspected before use. Keep space heaters three feet from anything that can burn, plug them directly into a wall outlet, and turn them off when unattended.
- **Cooking Safety** – Stay in the kitchen when frying or grilling. Keep flammable items away from stovetops. For grease fires, smother with a lid—never use water.
- **Decorations & Candles** – Check lights for damage before decorating. Keep candles on sturdy, nonflammable surfaces and never leave them unattended. Flameless LED candles are a safe alternative.
- **Outdoor Fires** – Follow local regulations, keep fires small, and never leave them unattended. Dispose of ashes in a metal container once completely cooled.
- **Smoke Alarms & Escape Plans** – Test alarms monthly, change batteries yearly, and replace units every 10 years. Ensure alarms are on every level of your home. Practice a family escape plan with two ways out and a safe meeting place.

Engineering / Water & Sewer Project Updates

Morris Turnpike – Water Main Extension

The Township's Water & Sewer staff, with assistance from Randolph DPW, installed approximately 750 feet of 8-inch DIP water main and a new fire hydrant along Morris Turnpike from #94 to Dover Chester Road during the week of July 28. This project eliminates a dead-end water main in the area, improving water conveyance and reliability. As part of the work, new water service stubs were also installed for existing properties to allow for potential future connections to the Township's water system.

Stormwater Management Facilities

As fall approaches and leaves begin to drop, residents are reminded that during seasonal maintenance and property clean-up, grass clippings, leaves, branches, and other debris must not be directed or discharged onto neighboring properties, Township property, or into stormwater management facilities such as detention basins, drainage ditches, swales, inlets, or manholes. Placing debris in these areas can block drainage, cause flooding, and create negative impacts for surrounding properties. While the Township provides curbside leaf collection from residential properties, residents must keep leaf piles separated from drainage structures to ensure they function properly during storm events. Thank you for helping to keep Randolph's stormwater system flowing and our community safe.

The Historical Society of Old Randolph



Carl and Augusta Andersen, the maternal grandparents of former Randolphian, Doris Lawrence Bush, owned this two story gable front and wing family folk style house, a type of architecture common to rural farm locales. The homestead was located within the "Centre Grove District" per Robinson's Atlas of 1887. Today, the property is known as Route 10 west bound near Millbrook Avenue. This house was eventually razed and the property sold, and became the 'home' to Nagel's Candy Barn in 1973, the Nagel family's third location. In 2017, Nagel's Candy Barn was sold and razed to make way for a Wawa gasoline station and convenience store location
