SeeClickFix

Randolph Township has implemented a new citizen request management platform known as SeeClickFix. Through this platform, residents can report non-emergency concerns that will be directly routed to township departments for review.

To report an issue, residents can use the SeeClickFix portal available on the [township website](#) (click Report A Concern) or download the SeeClickFix app from the Apple Store or Google Play Store. The process is intuitive and user-friendly; simply select the category of concern, identify the location, and provide any additional details, photos and descriptions. Once submitted, the appropriate township department will receive the submitted information and communicate their progress back to the requestor.

Concerns reported through SeeClickFix are evaluated during regular business hours; the platform is not monitored 24/7. For emergencies, call 911. If you have an urgent non-emergency concern, the Randolph Police Department can be reached at 973-989-7000.





Public Meetings

Township Manager

As prescribed by the township's council-manager form of government, the Township Manager serves as both the chief executive and chief administrative officer of the township.

The Township Manager oversees all municipal departments, coordinates the day-to-day operations of the community, and carries out the policies as set by the elected Township Council.

Acting as the principal liaison between council members, township departments, and the general public, the township manager oversees a broad spectrum of township functions.

Clerk's Office

The office of the Township Clerk, staffed by the Township Clerk and support personnel, serves three broad functions in Randolph.

Secretary

The clerk is responsible for managing records related to the township's local ordinances, resolutions, and public proceedings. Key duties include preparing and maintaining minutes for Township Council meetings, processing, recording, and filing ordinances and resolutions, and coordinating the legal advertising of ordinances and official documents. Additionally, the office offers notary services to the community.

Election Official

The clerk oversees processes for voter registration, petitions for vacancies in local elected offices, furnishing materials for local elections, polling area selection, and calculating and maintaining custody of election results.

Licensing Official

The clerk serves as the township's licensing and permitting official. The office primarily processes permits and licenses for liquor sales, livery operations, solicitor activities, amusement operations, bingo/raffles licenses, temporary outdoor sales, and soil movements.

Planning and Zoning

Staffed by a Planning & Zoning Administrator and a Zoning Officer, the Planning/Zoning/ Geographical Information Systems division administers all matters concerning township land use and planning activities.

Planning activities include:

- Advising on the completeness of applications pending before both boards.
- Interfacing with consulting engineers and planners employed by the Township Council and township boards.
- Supervising the development and maintenance of the GIS system. Administering the tree protection and replacement ordinance.

Zoning activities include:

- Issuing zoning permits and zoning certificates of occupancy.
- Performing regular inspections within the township to ensure compliance with zoning ordinances and approvals.
- Issuing warning notices and/or summonses for violations of the zoning code or violations of site plan conditions as set by the Planning Board or Board of Adjustment.

Engineering Department

The Randolph Township Division of Engineering maintains all technical records related to township-owned and operated property, facilities, and utility infrastructure.

Daily activities include:

- Inspections of ongoing development sites.
- Design of small to medium township-coordinated construction projects.
- Preparation of requests for proposals for major township construction projects.
- Planning of public works and other utility projects.

Division professionals, under the direction of the Township Engineer, provide planning and technical oversight related to improvements and other work performed relative to the township's roadways, water, and sewer networks, as well as the township's parks and trails.

Department of Public Works (DPW)

The Randolph Township Department of Public Works, overseen by the director of public works, provides a variety of services through the division of public roads, vehicle maintenance and recycling, and the division of sewer and water.

Seasonal and ongoing activities include:

- General street repairs, as well as snow and ice removal, on the township's 146-mile roadway network.
- Curbside collection of recyclables and operation of the Recycling Center (located at 1345 Sussex Turnpike).
- Maintenance of the township's police, rescue, fire, and administrative vehicles.
- Administration of the leaf collection, brush collection, and mulch delivery programs.
- Traffic sign maintenance and roadway striping.

In addition to the above, the division handles general landscaping as well as minor repairs to township-owned facilities.

Water and Sewer

The Randolph Township Division of Water and Sewer conducts maintenance operations of the township's sewer and water networks through the Randolph Township Division of Engineering. The division works to ensure that safe drinking water and reliable waste collection services are provided to those properties that are served by the systems.

The division maintains a network consisting of:

- 145 miles of potable water mains
- 82 miles of sanitary sewers
- 9 sanitary sewer pumping stations
- 1 water pressure booster station

The Randolph Township Department of Finance handles all financial activities associated with the township's water and sewer enterprises. Finance Department

The Randolph Township Department of Finance is overseen by the chief financial officer (CFO) and provides for the coordination of all the township's fiscal operations.

It controls budgetary expenditures, administers the township's debt and cash management programs, prepares year-end financial statements, and makes recommendations to the township manager and township council with regard to financial policy. The township's excellent financial management practices and fiscal responsibility are reflected in its "AAA" bond rating from Standard and Poor's and "AAA" bond rating from Moody's.

Within the Finance Department are the following divisions: assessments, tax collection, treasurer, and water and sewer.

Division of Assessments: Headed by a certified Tax Assessor, this division is responsible for the valuation of all real property in the township for taxation purposes and for maintaining assessment records for each property.

Division of Tax Collection & Treasurer: Headed by a certified Tax Collector, this division prepares tax bills, maintains an accounting of all tax collections, and enforces the collection of delinquent taxes through foreclosure of municipal tax liens and municipal tax sales.

Division of Water & Sewer: Is responsible for preparing and processing quarterly service charges and maintaining records of water consumption and sewage system usage.

The Randolph Township Department of Finance's Tax Assessment and Tax Collection Divisions have put the following information together to address the most frequently asked questions.

In addition, the Association of Municipal Assessors of New Jersey has teamed up with the New Jersey Society of Certified Public Accountants and the New Jersey Realtors to offer the **New Jersey Homeowner's Guide to Property Taxes**; this packet is available for download at www.randolphnj.org/255/FAQs.

Division of Assessments

Where can I obtain information regarding property assessment data?

For information regarding property assessment data, please visit the Morris County Board of Taxation's website, mcweb1.co.morris.nj.us/mctaxboard.

What is the tax rate and how is it calculated?

The tax rate is calculated by dividing the net taxable value (the ratable base determined by the assessor) by the total property tax levy each year.

What if I do not agree with my tax assessment? How do I file an appeal?

Despite its description, a tax appeal is not an appeal of property taxes. A tax appeal is an appeal of the property tax assessment determined by the tax assessor. Appeals must be filed with the Morris County Board of Taxation on or before April 1st of the tax year in question.

It is recommended that before you file an appeal, you speak to the Tax Assessor to discuss your assessed value. The New Jersey Division of Taxation provides an informational brochure regarding tax appeals entitled *A Guide To Tax Appeal Hearings*, which can be downloaded at www.randolphnj.org or www.state.nj.us. For tax appeal forms, please contact the Morris County Board of Taxation at 973.285.6707.

What is an added assessment?

New construction, structural additions, and renovations to a home result in an increased value and an increased property tax assessment. The assessor is responsible for the determination of assessed value for new construction/renovations completed in the tax year. The process includes the review of all permits, certificates of approval and occupancy, an inspection of properties, and the valuation of the added assessment.

An added assessment is prorated based on the number of months the work has been completed. For example, if construction is completed in February, the added assessment would be prorated for ten months of the year. Added assessment bills are typically sent in early October and are due by November 1st.

Division of Tax Collection & Treasurer

When are real estate taxes due?

Real estate taxes are due on February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1.

Is there a grace period?

The township allows for a ten-day grace period for receipt of the taxes. Any property tax payment received after the tenth calendar day is considered late, and interest will be charged back to the first day due. Payment is the date of receipt, not postmarked date. The delinquent interest rate is 8% on the first \$1,500 and 18% on amounts above.

Where do I pay my taxes?

The tax collection division is in the municipal building and is open Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. For your convenience, there is also a drop-off box located by the front door of the municipal building. All transactions deposited in the box will be posted the next day.

Can I pay my property taxes online?

The Township of Randolph is pleased to offer you the opportunity to pay your property taxes online, 24/7, from the comfort and convenience of your home or office. The secure online tax payment services are provided as a convenience and the provider charges a convenience fee of \$1.95 per e-check transaction and 2.95% per credit/debit card transaction and can be accessed at www.randolphnj.org/471/Online-Payments.

Where do my tax dollars go?

The property tax is divided among the County of Morris, the Randolph Board of Education, and the township.

Are there any deductions/exemptions available to veterans, seniors, or disabled persons?

There are several property tax benefits that are offered at the local level, a few of which are:

- Annual Property Tax Deduction for Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons
- Annual Property Tax Deduction for Veterans/Surviving Spouses
- Property Tax Exemption for 100% Disabled Veterans

Are there any property tax relief programs available?

Yes, there are tax relief programs offered by the State of New Jersey for Seniors and Social Security Disability Recipients which is the PAS. The PAS combines the Senior Freeze, Anchor, and Stay NJ.

If you are not a Senior or a Social Security Disability Recipient, you may apply for the ANCHOR if the State of NJ is not applying automatically for you.

Health Department

The township provides a wide variety of health-related services including public health nursing services, environmental health activities, animal control, vital statistics maintenance, and curbside garbage collection (see pg. 15) through the Department of Health and Construction Codes.

- **Public Health Nursing Services:** Includes health screenings, clinics, flu immunizations, health counseling, and referrals. Visit the [township website](#) for details.
- **Environmental Health Activities:** Inspections of food establishments, vending machines, rentals, bathing places, and campgrounds, along with monitoring waste disposal, water supplies, and septic systems.
- **Animal Control:** Provides animal rescue, operates the animal shelter and dog park, conducts rabies immunization clinics, and issues dog and cat licenses.
- **Vital Statistics:** Records births, deaths, marriages, and civil unions within the township.

Construction Department

Also known as the Office of Construction Codes, the Building/Construction Department administers and enforces the provisions of New Jersey's Uniform Construction Code, the state's approved building, plumbing, electrical, and fire subcodes, and any local ordinances which govern construction activities.

Duties include:

- Building and renovation plan reviews
- Inspections to investigate possible violations of the land use chapter
- Directing the issuance of permits for all construction activity within the township
- Conducting inspections and issuing Certificates of Occupancy and Certificates of Approval

Subcode officials also periodically inspect structures and land in the township, investigate potential violations, and issue violation notices in cases of non-compliance.

The Randolph Township Police Department prides itself on delivering professional police services to township residents and the public at large. The department views community involvement as a top priority and its members consistently demonstrate this commitment.

The Randolph Township Fire Department provides fire suppression, fire code enforcement, and public education services to township residents. The department is served by active volunteer firefighters who are accessible by pagers and provide 24-hour fire suppression services from four fire stations strategically located throughout the township.

Additionally, the department maintains a Bureau of Fire Prevention that enforces New Jersey's Uniform Fire Safety Code. The bureau's staff includes a full-time fire sub-code official and two part-time fire inspectors.

The township has 11 functioning Boards, Advisory, and Committee groups. For a calendar of scheduled Board/Committee meetings, as well as member and term directories, visit www.randolphnj.org.

Board of Adjustment

The board hears development applications that are not in compliance with zoning regulations.

Board of Health

The advisory board provides advice to the Township Council and interfaces with the Township Health Officer monthly. The board is charged with recommending measures to meet the health needs of the township.

Economic Development Committee

The committee acts as a liaison agent between existing business/industry and the departments of the township and the Township Council.

Environmental and Landmark Committee

The committee lends oversight to the protection, development, and use of open space and natural resources within the township and the protection, enhancement, and preservation of township sites and structures with historical, architectural, or cultural significance.

Library Trustees

The Board of Trustees for the Randolph Township Free Public Library oversees library operations.

Parks Advisory Committee

The committee acts in an advisory capacity to the Township Council on matters relating to the use and development of open space areas available within the township.

Planning Board

The board hears subdivision and site plan applications that are generally in accordance with the township's land development regulations.

Recreation Advisory Committee

The committee develops and recommends to the Township Council a year-round program of recreational activities for all township residents to be administered by the Department of Parks & Recreation.

Traffic Advisory Committee

The committee works to identify and resolve traffic issues in the township.

Trails Advisory Committee

The committee serves as an advisory board to the Township Council on the use, development, and maintenance of the township trail system as well as the implementation of the trails master plan.

Wildlife Management Advisory

Committee

The committee serves as the advisory board to the Township Council on animal control programs.

Curbside Trash Collection

The Township of Randolph provides residential curbside garbage collection once per week to all township streets except for garden apartment complexes. Collection routes and schedules vary depending on your neighborhood.

Garbage should be placed at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day, and no earlier than 9:00 p.m. the evening before the collection day. Please do not put out the trash before the day of the collection as it is unsightly and a potential health hazard.

Additionally, empty garbage cans must be removed from the curb no later than sundown on collection day. Trash should be left in covered 32-gallon containers or heavy-duty plastic bags and not exceed 30 pounds each. Loose household items must be placed curbside in bags or cans (not recyclable cardboard boxes).

Large Item Collection:

- You may put out one large household item on each garbage collection day, i.e., couch, chair, mattress, box spring, paint cans (completely dried out and empty), or rolled and tied rug/carpet (approximately 110 sq. ft., no more than 4 feet long).
- A curbside collection of refrigerators, stoves, and other major appliances (white goods) is available year-round by advance arrangement. To have one or more of these items removed, call the health department at 973.989.7050. There is a fee of \$30.00 per item.
- Items weighing over 200 pounds or longer than 5 feet will not be collected.
- Items such as glass table tops, mirrors, and any other large glass item that is a risk of shattering and cause injury will not be collected.

****Important Notes Regarding Alerts, Weather, and Holidays****

Alerts

If collection services are cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, announcements advising so will be posted on the township website's home page, the Recycling and Garbage Subscriber Notification ([Notify Me](#)), and through other communication mediums (Facebook, Twitter, electronic signs). Residents are also encouraged to download the free Recycle Coach Mobile App (available on both the Apple and Google Play Stores).

Weather

If curbside pickup services are canceled due to snow, makeup days are the next business day (Saturday, if your regular day is Friday), weather permitting. The curbside collection of trash and recyclables is a contracted service so, in the event of inclement weather, the decision to cancel or suspend service is left to the contractor's discretion.

Holidays

If curbside pickup services are canceled due to a holiday, makeup days can be found online at www.randolphnj.org.

Recycling

Residents are required to recycle, and we encourage every family to recognize the importance of this civic responsibility. Not only does recycling benefit our environment, but it also impacts favorably on the township budget and your taxes. We make it easy for residents with our centrally-located recycling center and bimonthly curbside collection of recyclables.

Recycling Center

The Randolph Township Recycling Center accepts materials from Randolph residents only. Residency stickers are required for all vehicles entering the center. These stickers are free and good for as long as you own your vehicle. Residents can obtain separate stickers for each vehicle. Stickers are issued at the recycling center (stop by the office) or at the Randolph Township Division of Engineering at the Municipal Building. Bring proof of residency (i.e., vehicle registration) when you come.

Curbside Single Stream Recycling

Curbside collection of recyclables is provided every other week to all town streets except for garden apartments. To determine your route number and collection day visit the Garbage and Recycling page at www.randolphnj.org/205/Recycling-Garbage.

You can find a full list of accepted recyclables on the township website as well as other restrictions and requirements for collections. All recycling should be placed curbside by 6:00 a.m. to ensure pickup.

Recycle Coach

The Recycle Coach app provides personalized collection schedule reminders, recycling education, waste disposal tips, and much more. Residents are encouraged to download this free mobile app which is available on the Apple and Google Play Store.

Grass, Branches, and Leaves

This includes basic yard debris. The maximum acceptable branch size is 4 feet long by 4 inches in diameter. Branches that meet specified size requirements are accepted at the recycling center year-round. Please, no stumps.

Grass clippings may be dropped off at the recycling center on weekends only. No other lawn debris is accepted. The clippings should be put in containers (bags, garbage cans). There is no curbside collection for the clippings.

Dog and Cat Licenses

Pursuant to township ordinance, all dogs and cats seven months or older must be licensed and have a current tag affixed to a collar or harness.

- All dogs must be licensed by January 31st of each year; all cats must be licensed by February 28th each year.
- Rabies vaccination must be current through November 30 for dogs and December 31 for cats each licensing year to comply with the New Jersey State Department of Health requirement that the expiration date of the rabies vaccination expires no more than two months before the end of the licensing period.
- Proof of rabies vaccination must be produced before the license will be issued. See below for information regarding our rabies immunization voucher program.
- Proof of neutering/spaying is required to obtain an exemption from additional fees.
- Newly acquired dogs and cats that attain licensing age must be licensed within ten days after such acquisition.

Free Rabies Immunization Voucher Program: Free rabies vaccinations are available to all dogs and cats belonging to Randolph and Rockaway Borough residents. These clinics are located at the offices of participating veterinarians between Jan. 1 and Feb. 28.

The Health Department issues vouchers that are accepted by participating local veterinarians. You will not be required to pay in advance; the veterinarian takes care of the paperwork. Veterinarians request that you call ahead to schedule an appointment for vaccinations. If you use a rabies voucher, you MUST bring the license application (Two copies) and a completed rabies voucher form with you to the veterinarian.

TRAIL ACCESS POINTS

Brundage Park

Located on Carrell Road. The Brundage Park Preserve is also home to the Randolph Fairy Trail. Parking areas can be found in several locations.

Freedom Park

Located on Millbrook Avenue. Parking areas can be found on both sides of Millbrook.

Heistein Park

Located on Doby Road, off South Road. Parking areas are found at Heistein's Pond, just below the park, on Doby Road.

Clyde Potts Trail Head

Located approximately one-half mile south of Sussex Turnpike on Old Brookside Road. Parking is available.

Cohn Farm Trail Head

Located on Center Grove Road. Parking is available.

Town Hall Trail Head

Located on Millbrook Avenue, opposite Randolph High School. Parking is available.

Hidden Valley Trail Head

Located on Everdale Road, one-quarter mile south of Millbrook Avenue. Parking is available.

Combs Hollow Trail Head

A small parking area exists at the intersection of Combs Hollow and Doby Road. This is a Patriots' Path connection.

Mountainside Trail Head

Located on Mountainside Road. Parking is available

Veterans Community Park Loop Trails

Located on Calais Road. There are several loop trails within the park, in addition to trails connected to Heistein Park and Patriot's Path. Parking is available.

Randolph's trail system runs a 17-mile course traversing six parks, the Clyde Potts Reservoir Watershed, and 2,000 acres of pristine open space. The trails link together schools with neighborhoods and connect to Patriots' Path at Combs Hollow and Old Brookside.

Open year-round, the trails can be used from dawn to dusk and are closed at night. During the winter months, there is no snow or ice removal, providing an excellent opportunity for cross-country skiers and snowshoe enthusiasts.

****Rules of the Trails****

- Hours: The trails are open from dawn to dusk and are closed after sunset.
- Dogs must be controlled on a 6-foot leash at all times. Please clean up after your dog.
- Motor vehicles, ATVs, and dirt bikes are prohibited.
- Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is strictly forbidden.
- Bicyclists should conform to helmet laws, have warning bicycle bells, and yield to all pedestrians.
- Horses are not allowed on the trails.

Randolph Free Public Library

Homework Help: A directory of reliable resources for students to access references and utilize for information.



CCM's convenient location at 214 Center Grove Rd, makes the commute easy for students, and the college's many career training and workforce services are great resources for local business owners to utilize.







Randolph Township Elections and Voter Information

Voting is an important part of living in a democracy, and all Randolph residents are encouraged to take part in the process. You may register to vote if you are a native-born or naturalized citizen who is:

- 18 years old by election day
- A resident of Morris County at least 30 days before an election
- Not adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be lacking the capacity to understand the act of voting
- Not serving a sentence, or on parole or probation for an indictable offense



You may register to vote at any time; however, the registration deadline to vote at the next election is 21 days before election day.

You may register to vote by completing a registration application. This form is available from the Randolph Township Clerk and the Morris County Superintendent of Elections, as well as a host of other state agencies, including motor vehicle agencies.

For your convenience, we have made the voter registration application available online at www.randolphnj.org/224/Voter-Information. To view it, you will need the freely available Adobe Reader software installed on your computer.

If you choose to register by mail, the application must be returned to the Morris County Superintendent of Elections, P.O. Box 900, Morristown, NJ 07963-9912. First-time registrants by mail who have never voted in a federal election should see www.morriscountynj.gov for additional details/requirements.

****Any voter who moves from one county to another must register in his/her new county. Any person who changes his/her name by marriage, divorce, or judgment of a court must notify the Board of Elections. ****
